

## **Maintenance Team: Electrician**

### **Main Duties**

- To be fully qualified and conversant with current practises especially safety, bearing in mind that members of the public will be visiting the building and possibly coming into contact with displays etc.
- Be prepared to become involved in helping to design and instal lighting and interactive displays.
- To maintain all electrical devices, lights (including outside lighting), security cameras, heating and power tools in conjunction with the Maintenance Team Leader who will supply extra assistance if required.
- Be prepared to work outside hours if the need should arise.
- To be able to advise the team leader regarding purchasing of electrical items.
- To either perform or direct PAT testing to ensure all portable tools and equipment are in good and safe working order.

### **How much time would I be expected to give?**

Two and a half hours during working sessions on Tuesday and Thursday mornings.

### **What skills, qualities and experience do I need?**

- Applicants must be fully qualified
- The ability to work alone or with other team members
- The ability to explain to lay people any issues relating to the role.

### **What support and training will I receive?**

- A copy of the volunteer handbook and induction procedure
- The opportunity to participate in occasional internal training sessions

### **.What opportunities will I get**

- Join an enthusiastic team with a shared interest in local history
- Develop your skills and experience
- Meet new people within the local community
- Free tea, coffee and biscuits at each session
- The chance to make a significant contribution to the running of Seaford Museum

### **Other Information**

- This role is open to volunteers aged 18+
- This role is not a regulated activity and does not, therefore, require an additional safeguarding (DBS) check.
